

## Workshop on Dissemination of Research Findings: Research for Improved Evidence-Based Planning: Reproductive Health Care Services in Thai Nguyen

Under a grant funded by the Atlantic Philanthropies through Population Council Vietnam, Thai Nguyen University of Medicine and Pharmacy (TN-UMP) in collaboration with Institute of Social and Medical Studies (ISMS) implemented the project titled Primary Health Improvement Initiative-Intervention Phase (PHI-IP) from October 2010 to December 2011. The project aimed to conduct research for improved evidence-based planning, particularly in family planning and reproductive health care services in Thai Nguyen. One of the project objectives is to build the capacity in scientific research skills of faculty and students from TN-UMP through mentorship and joint research. These researchers conducted studies in family planning and other sexual and reproductive health issues facing women in Thai Nguyen province. The studies gave special attention to the needs of women from indigent and ethnic minority backgrounds.



Research conducted under the project generated promising findings with the potential to create lasting improvements in the delivery of reproductive health care services for Vietnamese women in general and for those living in Thai Nguyen province in particular. These findings were presented at a one-day workshop held in December 2011.
